Curt Campbell - April 2024



Curtis (Curt) W. Campbell was born in Rochester, MN, in March of 1934. He lived on a farm south of Rochester in Simpson, MN, with parents Howard and Freeda. The family moved to Rochester in the late 1940s, where Curt finished high school in 1952.

Right out of high school, Curt joined the **Ice Capades.** He skated and traveled with the show for two years from coast to coast in the USA and Canada. He then joined the Air Force, serving three years at Elmendorf Air Force based in Anchorage, AK. After his time there, Curt went to the University of Floria, where he received an associate

degree in Radiology. Immediately after that, he went to Duke and earned an associate degree in Nuclear Medicine.

Down Memory Lane with Holly Lynn Johnson



Lynn-Holly Johnson won the silver medal at the novice level of the 1974 U.S. Figure Skating Championships. She gave up competitive skating in 1977 to turn professional and join the Ice Capades, and subsequently began an acting career, making her film debut in "Ice Castles" (1978), in which she portrayed Alexis "Lexie" Winston, a figure skater who is blinded by a blood clot in her brain.

The production originally wanted to cast a name

actress in the role and use a real-life ice-skater as a double for the complex skating scenes. However, it soon became apparent to them, in their opinion, that despite the best editing

and camera-work, the differences between the actor and the double would be noticeable, particularly as the choreography would require a number of close-ups and medium shots.

Johnson was cast after she was brought to the attention of the filmmakers by ice-skating coach John Nicks. Johnson, who was on tour with the **Ice Capades** show, flew to Minnesota for a script reading and to perform some ice-skating. Johnson then flew back to the show then a week later flew to Toronto, Canada for a screen-test. Johnson landed the role and signed on not long after this.

Johnson refused to do a nude scene in the film. The producers kept trying to write a nude scene in the movie for her, but she walked off the set and halted production for a day rather than appear nude. Johnson admitted in a People magazine interview that it tickled her that after all these years, people come up to her and tell her how great a family movie this is, and she thinks, "You have no idea!" 

RELIVING FOND MEMORIES



Doug Martin had published two books called 'Frozen Community' where he wanted to have skaters tell funny stories about their time on the road. Stories were posted before but worth sharing again.

Yvonne Mjelde Lange joined Ice Capades in 1962, soon after graduating from high school. Yvonne says that going into the show wasn't all hard work, but did require complete commitment from all the performers.

As important as Ice Capades was in her life she was willing to give it up for love and marriage. Here is Yvone in her own words: When I was a little girl our family doctor encouraged my mom to get into skating to correct a minor pigeon toe problem I had. It worked ad I became interested in learning the finer details in the art of skating.

When I was seven years old, I watched a movie starting Olympic ice skating gold medal winner Sonja Henie. I loved the gorgeous costumes and glitter of the ice show. I was hooked and could envision myself in glitzy costumes like Sonja's. I started taking advanced skating lessons t the Ballard Ice Arena in Seattle, Washington, along with public skating sessions. My parents were not rich, but could afford private lessons in the office hours when skating lessons were less costly. My day began with lessons at 6:00 am. After which I went to school. That was my schedule for several years, and I learned my craft well. I loved performing in the annual charity Ice Parade show, as well as skating at Christmas in a storefront window at Frederick and Nelson, a famous department store in Seattle.

I graduated from high school in 1951, and was hired by a national insurance company tow work in the office. It wasn't my cup of tea, so in December of that year, I auditioned for Ice Capades when I learned they were looking for new cast members, and was hired on the spot. I gave my employer my two=week notice and joined the tour in January 1962, in Calgary, AB, Canada. I loved every minute of my time with Ice Capades. I especially loved my fellow performers, and the beautiful costumes I wore in the show. My childhood dream had become a reality.

In 1964, I was introduced to a tall, handsome blond named Bruno Lange, a Vancouver businessman. We were immediately attracted to each other, and courted for two years, exchanging love letters and enjoying the occasional visit when my schedule allowed. I left Ice Capades on Valentine's Day, 1966, to be with Bruno. We married in January, 1968, and are still in love 44 years later. Our son, Kirk, was born in 1970. Kirk and his wife, Sequoia, presented up with our first grandchild, Finn William Lange. Since his retirement, Bruno as written and published two books. Hi first, *Born into Turmoil*, is being considered for a Hollywood movie. I work as a designer of high-end jewelry, but will soon retire to spend more time with Bruno.

MEETING OF DIRECTORS of the ICE-CAPADES, INC.

Following meeting of the Arena Managers' Association, a meeting of Ice-Capades Inc. was called on Thursday, July 11th, at the Hotel

New Yorker. Those present were: Messrs. Harris, Brown, Sutphin,

Tyrrell, Sollenberger and Podoloff.

Mr.Russell Markert, well-known New York producer, who has been engaged as producer for the Ice-Capades show, came before the directors and outlined his ideas for the show, presenting sketches of costumes to go with same. Mr.Markert also stated that he felt that a male and woman singer would be a great asset to the show.

Mr. Harris asked the directors what they thought of Mr. Markert's ideas for the show, and it was the consensus of opinion that they were very good and the directors also agreed to the idea of having a male and woman singer in the show.

Mr.Harris commented that he felt possibly that the opening number might be a little heavy and suggested something lighter and Mr.Tyrrell was of the same opinion. However, after putting it to a vote, the majority of the directors felt that the entire arrangement of the show should be left in the hands of Mr.Markert and that he should be in full charge.

Mr.Markert stated that he needed 12 chorus mon in the show, but Mr.Tyrrell had only allowed 4 men in his budget. After considerable discussion on this point, it was decided to increase the budget to allow for 8 extra men.

Mr.Markert stated that special music would be written for the show, with at least 4 song hits, which would not be published until after the opening of the show.

Mr. Harris announced the officers to be elected for the coming year, President, Vice President and Treasurer, Secretary and Asst. Treasurer.

Eddie Shore made a motion, seconded by John Sollenberger, to re-elect the same officers who had served in the past year and a unanimous vote was cast.


Mr. Harris then brought up the matter of a third ice show to be sponsored jointly by Ice Capades and Ice Follies. This idea had been shelved a year ago because of various disadvantages present at the time. At this time, however, the idea met with considerable favor. Mr. Harris has already discussed the idea with the Ice Follies and made tentative plans which Mr. Harris presented at this meeting.

With soldiers returning to the ice shows, and more and more talent developing, there will be a sufficiency of talent for a third ice show. This show would be called the ICE REVELS. One half the show would be owned by Ice Follies and one half by Ice Capades. Corporation papers have been drawn up in the name of International Ice Attractions, Inc. This corporation is not only
