Marion Dwyer Miller – August 20, 2024

Marion Dwyer Miller died peacefully on August 20, 2024 at age 94. Preceding Marion in death were her parents, Shelden Hibbard and Dorothy Carland Hibbard, her first husband D. Lynn Dwyer, her second husband Lorenz Miller and her sister Lois Dietrich.

Marion was born on June 21, 1930 in <u>Duluth, MN</u> and enjoyed her musical studies (violin and voice) in school, which led to her majoring in music education and playing in the orchestra at Carnegie Tech (now Carnegie Mellon University) in Pittsburgh, PA. She loved ice skating and continued to do this at a high level after moving to Pittsburgh. She met her eventual husband Lynn Dwyer through the Pittsburgh Figure Skating Club and joined him as a performer on ice with the professional touring company, the "**Ice Capades**" in 1954. She and Lynn visited many cities during this time. Both of them agreed

that Minneapolis would be a great place to live and start a family. Marion and Lynn had two children, Keith and Loren. Marion worked at Schmitt Music and as a choir director at St. George's Episcopal Church in St. Louis Park while raising her children.

#### Lucien & Rika Boyer – August 23, 2024 & June 18, 2024

Lucien & Friederike (Rika) Boyer, the Best Ice Skating Adagio Act of their time, both passed away within a few short months of each other. Rika died peacefully at Nathan Adelson Hospice on June 18th and Lucien joined her when he passed at Mountain View Hospital on August 23, 2024. Friederike Maria Schropp was born on March 7, 1934 in Munich, Germany to parents Johann & Frieda who encouraged their only child to take skating lessons at the age of 10. She excelled in the sport and won Germany's Junior Figure Skating Championship and competed internationally as Junior Ladies Champion. Lucien Renee Boyer was born February 18, 1929 to Marcel & Yvoppe in Paris and started skating later in life at age at 20. Born for the sport, Lucien won the French Pairs Championship for two successive years with a previous partner. Ice Capades Producer,

John Harris saw the young Miss Schropp in the Baier Ice Revue and thought she was outstanding. Terry Rudolph, European Talent Scout suggested Lucien Boyer as a partner for Rika and it was an Adagio Act made in heaven. The Boyer's became internationally acclaimed appearing in many Premiere Skating Shows including; Ice Follies, Ice Capades, Holiday on Ice Europe and more. In retirement from Show Skating, the Boyer's relocated to Foster City, CA where they enjoyed a successful coaching career. After years of 5:00 am sessions they decided to retire move to Las Vegas where they lived happily for 22 years. Over the last several years they faced daunting medical challenges with Rika surviving a serious stroke and Lucien with terminal cancer. Lucien & Rika had no children but were truly loved by many. Mass will be at 11am Fri., Oct. 11 at St.

#### Roy Blakey – August 24, 2024



Blakey, Roy A. "Lucky, lucky, lucky" is how Roy Blakey, 94, described his life, which ended peacefully, surrounded by love, in his Minneapolis studio home on August 24, 2024. He was born in Tulsa, Oklahoma, on July 19, 1930, to Bernard and Josie Blakey, whose strong roots helped give him wings to follow his bliss - professional figure skating, traveling the world and photographing both. Roy's love of skating was inspired by ice skating Olympic champion and movie star, Sonja Henie, but lack of an ice rink turned him into a champion roller skater. Drafted in the Army, he was sent to

Germany in 1952, where he taught himself figure skating, eventually landing his first professional job performing in an ice show in Garmisch at the Casa Carioca, a U.S. Military nightclub. Returning to America to study photography under the G.I. Bill, Roy landed a job skating in the Conrad Hilton Hotel's Boulevard Room in Chicago, performing there for five years before traveling twice around the world with Holiday on Ice International. Roy honed his photography skills by making portraits of fellow skaters. Roy's camera got him detained for questioning in Russia, enabled him to photograph royal dignitaries who visited the show (including the King and Queen of Thailand), and photography helped him explore his new love of Asian culture, arts and people. In 1968, Roy settled in New York City to launch his career as a photographer to the stars of stage and screen. Debbie Allen, Blossom Dearie, Shirley MacLaine, Tommy Tune and Barry Manilow shared the limelight with downtown artists Candy Darling, Jackie Curtis and Divine - all frozen at the height of their beauty and careers in Roy's studio. Considered a pioneer of gay male photography, Roy was a regular contributor to After Dark and Dilettante magazines. His self-published photography book of male nudes entitled "HE" was the first book that featured exclusively male nudes (including full frontal!) to legally circulate via the U.S. mail after it first became legal to send nude photographs of men and not be deemed obscene by postal inspectors. "Roy Blakey's 1970s Male Nudes" (Goliath 2002) took a new look at the '70s photos. The book tour included exhibitions in NYC and San Francisco. In 1993, Roy moved to Minneapolis, settling in a NYC-style loft building, sharing the studio side with his niece and fellow photographer, Keri Pickett. With additional space and nostalgic for his time in the ice shows, Roy resumed collecting the history of theatrical figure skating, a hobby he started when he was 11 years old. Roy Blakey's IceStage Archive is now the largest treasure trove of costumes, posters, programs and memorabilia from the ice show world ranging from his beloved Sonja Henie's shows to Ice Follies, Ice Capades, Holiday on Ice and Disney On Ice. Roy's career and collection helped inspire and inform Keri Pickett's documentary feature film, "The Fabulous Ice Age" (72 minutes, 2013), covering the century of the great American touring ice shows and Roy's efforts to save its history. Keri is currently in production on a documentary chronicling his extraordinary life entitled, "Uncle Roy." Roy is survived by his sister, B.J. French of Key West and Minneapolis, along with her daughters and Roy's nieces, Kim Mahling of Senegal, West Africa, and Arlington, Virginia, and Keri Pickett of Minneapolis. He was preceded in death by his parents and sister, Marian Spencer. A memorial service will take place Saturday, September 7, (9 a.m. visiting time and 10 a.m. service), at Lakewood Cemetery Chapel in Minneapolis, Minnesota. # \$23M plan to demolish, replace ice rink named after legendary skater Dorothy Hamill

The Town of Greenwich is developing plans to demolish the skating rink named after ice skating legend Dorothy Hamill and replace it with a new 40,000-square-foot ice-skating center. Hamill, who won a gold medal at the Olympic Winter Games Innsbruck in 1976, grew up in Greenwich. Hamill won an Emmy Award for her appearance on TV in the program "Romeo & Juliet On Ice," and for a time owned and operated the Ice Capades ice show.

The existing rink was built in 1971. The Greenwich First Selectmen expect to spend \$23 million in Fiscal Year 2027, which begins in July 2026, on the construction project at the Eugene Morlot Memorial Park. The new rink would continue to be named in honor of Hamill.



In addition to a new building housing the new rick, the plans that have been developed so far incorporate improvements to parking, driveways, pathways and sidewalks around the rink along with a new ball field. While 22 trees are to be removed to make room for the ball field, 47 are to be planted, a net increase of 25 trees. It's anticipated that

construction would begin in the fall of 2026 and that the new skating building would open in the fall of 2027.


Greenwich says that the rink serves thousands of users each year including figure skaters, public skaters, youth hockey groups for boys and girls, and teams from Greenwich High School.

"At present, the 50-year-old facility has a number of fundamental and critical issues," Greenwich says. "Notably substandard ice size and inadequate, aging, and non-codecompliant equipment, building systems and fixtures. The town intends to build a new, high quality single rink facility on the property capable of serving town users for the decades to come."

The Morlot Memorial Park occupies 13.4 acres including the Dorothy Hamill Rink, Strazza Field baseball diamond, a parking lot, a playscape, swing set, the Byram Veterans' Memorial Tree Grove, a wooded area and a grassy hillside.

The new skating rink building would be at the location of the existing rink. It would have an ice skating area measuring 200 feet by 85 feet and seating for 650. There would be locker rooms, a skate shop, lounge, meeting rooms, restrooms, and public lockers.

### Where are they now?



A master of the compulsory figures, the native of Dundas, Ontario's legendary work ethic enabled him to become an allround skater, incorporating powerful jumps, spins and intricate footwork into his programs.

Donald Knight who was born on June 8, 1947 is the 1965-1967 Canadian national champion in men's singles. He won the North American Figure Skating Championships in 1967, having placed third in the previous competition, in 1965. Knight also won the bronze medal at the World Figure Skating Championships in

1965. He trained with coach Ellen Burka.

After retiring from competitive skating, Knight toured for eleven years as a Principal Performer with Ice Capades and Holiday on Ice in Europe. Knight currently works as a skating coach consultant with the Burlington Skate Centre and Oakville Skating Club in Halton Region of Ontario, Canada.



### Jerry Lee Kidd with some more 'On the Road' memories



Here is another "on the road" story from me. 1979-80 Show "Let's Celebrate" had within it a production number "Latin Fire". This number began with a large motor driven stage driven to center ice with Heidi DeLio Thibert and I believe Michael Shinniman Flamenco Dancing with couples around the stage on the ice. I had wandered backstage and into the set as I often did just to look and check costumes. Freddie Trenkler's number ended with a blackout and count our starts rising, I start to exit the set when I am grabbed each arm by Bob Moskalyk and Mikey Donohue and no matter how I struggled they would not let me go. Them on skates me in

shoes. They drag me to center ice in front of the now arriving stage. I am listening to the announcement and know I don't have very much time before the lights come up. They let me go, now my dilemma, do I try to make it to the dash, or do I try my best to make it back to the set. I chose the latter, I make it to the set just in time but Jules, Ivor and Dave Hansen had seen what was going on and they held the curtain together so that I could not get through. Now I am in panic mode, just seconds before the lights come up, they let me through. Believe me, I never ventured into the set like that again.



Another on the road story. It's 1983 and we are doing "Skates Alive", it's February 11 Friday evening in New York's MSG and it has been snowing most of the day. When we leave the Garden that night its still snowing and traffic is virtually gone. Heading home we go to the liquor store across the street and stop at Quiznos which is still open. We were all sure we would not have to do the early matinee on Saturday morning because of the weather. When we finally went to bed that morning after drinking all night snowfall was over 12 inches so went to sleep for well deserved rest. 8:00AM.... Riiiinnnnnnggggg phones ringing all over Southgate Tower, we are doing the show this morning. Lots of hungover people stagger to the Garden through mounds of snow. We find out the show was sold out and if it went on Capades did not have to give refunds. Needless to say, no trains, no buses no public transportation at all. Just before the show was to start Dorothy and I went to look at the audience,

which there was none. There were more ushers than patrons. Dorothy and I went back to wardrobe, got paper plates and drew smiley faces on them and then took them out and taped them to the front row seats. By intermission the crowd had picked up a bit but it was strange seeing the Garden empty. Must have been like a dress rehearsal for the skaters.
